Excerpt from Christ Our Pascha

Structure of the Catechism

Part Two of the Catechism develops the liturgical understanding of Christ's Passover, based upon the words of Christ's institution of the Eucharist at the Mystical Supper [Last Supper] and as cited by the Anaphora. This is the Eucharistic heart from which proceed all the cycles of the Church's liturgical prayer (daily, weekly, yearly); from which flow the Holy Mysteries on their celebration; and from which spiritual life is born, and devotion flourishes. Who is Holy Myrhh-bearer Mary Magdalene?

Mentioned at least twelve times in the Gospels, St. Mary Magdalene is a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. Although in the West, she has been called a prostitute or sexually immoral, this is not supported in the scriptures. It is believed she was a Jewish woman who lived among Gentiles, living as they did. The Gospels agree Mary was originally a great sinner as Jesus cast seven demons out of her. After this, she told several women she knew and they also became followers. Scholars also debate if Mary Magdalene is the same unnamed women, a sinner, who weeps and washes Jesus' feet with her hair in the Gospel of John, doubting this is the same person. Despite the dispute over her background, what she did after meeting Jesus, is much



more significant. She was certainly a sinner whom Jesus saved, giving us an example of how no person is beyond the saving grace of God. During Jesus' ministry, she followed him, part of a semi-permanent entourage who served Jesus and his Disciples. Mary likely watched the crucifixion from a distance along with the other women who followed Christ during His ministry. Mary was present when Christ rose from the dead, visiting his tomb to anoint his body only to find the stone rolled away and Christ, very much alive, sitting at the place they laid Him. She was the first witness to His resurrection. After the death of Christ, a legend states that she remained among the early Christians. After fourteen years, she was allegedly put into a boat by Jews, along with several other saints of the early Church, and set adrift without sails or oars. The boat landed in southern France, where she spent the remaining years of her life living in solitude, in a cave. Her feast day is July 22.
