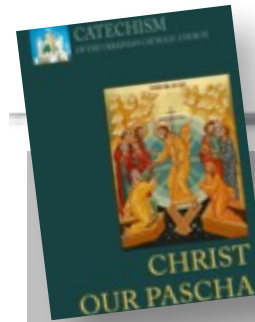

Excerpt from *Christ Our Pascha*

God's Word in Creation

Only God exists from all eternity, and it is he who has brought all creation from non-being into being. Only he possesses the fullness of life; whereas the world, having been created, owes its existence to him. God creates everything by his Word: “All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being” (*Jn 1:3; see Gn 1*). Nature, created by God, and nature's laws proceed from the Word: “For the voice... and command were as natural and permanent law [for the earth]; it gave fertility and the power to produce fruit for all ages to come.” The Word of God provides the norm, or law, as well as meaning to all creation: the phrase “God said” means that a wise and creative word has been imparted to every substance or nature. In the contemplation of nature, its established laws and harmony, we come to know the wisdom of the Creator in the beauty of his plan. All creation praises God, his majesty, his glory and wisdom: “The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims his handiwork” (*Ps 18 [19]:2*) (#21)

Parish Announcements.

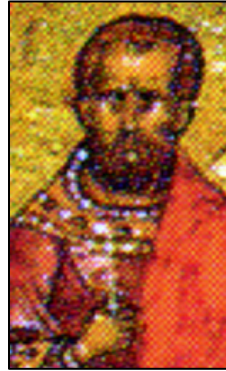

- In accord with the voting of our parishioners, it is the decision of the Pastoral Council and the Pastor that during Divine Liturgy the faithful should respond in English when the priest prays in English, and respond in Ukrainian when the priest prays in Ukrainian.
- We call upon all our parishioners to pray for peace in the world, especially for the end of the war and peace in Ukraine.

Who is Holy Martyr Eusignius (360-63)?

Eusignius was born at Antioch in the mid-third century. For 60 years he served in the Roman armies of emperors Diocletian, Maximian Hercules, Constantius Chlorus, Constantine the Great & his sons. Saint Eusignius was a companion of Saint Basiliscus, who wrote an account of his martyrdom. At the beginning of the reign of Saint Constantine the Great, Saint Eusignius was a witness to the appearance of the Cross in the sky, a prediction of victory. He retired in his old age from military service & returned to his own country, spending his time in prayer, fasting, & attending church. So he lived until the reign of Julian the Apostate (361-363), who yearned for a return to paganism. Through the denunciation of one of the Antiochian citizens, the saint stood trial as a Christian before the emperor Julian in the year 362. He fearlessly accused the emperor of apostasy from Christ, reproaching him with the example of his relative, Constantine the Great, & he described in detail how he himself had been an eyewitness to the appearance of the sign of the Cross in the sky. Julian did not spare the aged Saint Eusignius, then 110 years old, but had him beheaded.
