Holy Tradition

According to St. Irenaeus of Lyons, the essence of Holy Tradition is this - that all Christians share one and the same faith, by which they become partakers of God's life:

All receive one and the same God the Father, and believe in the same dispensation regarding the incarnation of the Son of God, and are cognizant of the same gift of the Spirit, and are conversant with the same commandments, and preserve the same form of ecclesiastical constitution, expect the same advent of the Lord, and await the same salvation of the complete man, that is, of the soul and body. What is the Nativity of St. John the Baptist?

Zacharias and his wife Elizabeth were devout believers but despite their fervent prayers, they were never blessed with children. Fifteen months before when would be the birth of Christ, Zacharias, who was a priest, was offering sacrifice in the Temple during the feast of the Tabernacles. While in the sanctuary, the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Zacharias and said to him, "Your prayer is heard; and your wife Elizabeth shall bear you a son, and you shall call his name John" (Luke 1:13). Knowing that Elizabeth was barren, and

that they both were elderly, Zacharias did not believe what the Angel told him, although he had before him the example of Abraham and Sarah, of Hannah, mother of the Prophet Samuel, and of other barren women in Israel who gave birth by the power of God. Due to his unbelief, he was condemned by the Archangel to remain speechless until the fulfilment of these words in their season, which also came to pass (Luke 1:7-24). After the baby's birth, according to Jewish tradition, on the eighth day, John was circumcised and his relatives wanted to give the child his father's name. Zacharias signaled for a tablet on which he wrote "His name shall be John" and immediately Zacharias regained the ability to speak. As a reward, Zacharias was given the gift of prophecy.
