

- 5. A warm welcome to all our visitors today. We invite you to join us for coffee and rolls following our Liturgy.




According to the testimony of St. Basil the Great, Holy Tradition is that which "the Lord himself taught us, what the apostles preached, what the Fathers held fast, and what the martyrs confirmed." It includes all that was transmitted to us by Christ himself, as well as the teaching of the apostles and the faith of the Church. Saint Basil notes:

... of the beliefs and practices which are preserved in the Church, some that we possess are derived from written teaching; others we have received, delivered to us through the Mysteries and by Apostolic Tradition; all of these in relation to true religion have the same force... Were we to attempt to reject such customs as having no written authority, on the ground that the importance they possess is small, we should unintentionally injure the Gospel in its essentials; or, rather, we would make our public definition a mere phrase and nothing more. Who is St. Gregory, Bishop of Great Armenia?

Gregory was born in 257, son of Anak who seeking the throne, had murdered his kinsman, Emperor Kursar, father of Tridates. Anak's family was marked for destruction. A relative safely carried infant Gregory from Armenia to Caesarea in Cappadocia & raised him as a Christian. Gregory married, had two sons, but soon was a widower. His son Orthanes became a priest: his son Arostanes was a monk living in the wilderness. To atone for his father's sin, Gregory faithfully served Tridates, who loved him like a friend, although he hated Christians. Once Armenian emperor, Tridates demanded



Gregory renounce Christ but the saint remained faithful. Tiridates had Gregory tortured: hanging him upside down with a stone about his neck, choking him with smoke, beating & ridiculing him, & had him walk in iron sandals inset with nails. While suffering, Gregory sang Psalms. In prison God healed all his wounds. Standing cheerful and unharmed, the emperor then gave orders to repeat the torments, but he endured them, not wavering. Hot tin was poured over him & he was thrown into a viper-filled pit. The Lord saved His chosen one: the snakes did him no harm. Some pious women secretly lowered bread into the pit to feed him. An angel, appeared to the martyr, strengthening & encouraging him. Gregory was in the pit 14 years. During this time the emperor Tiridates executed 37 holy virgins from a monastery in Asia Minor. God punished him by disfiguring he king's face. Once released, Gregory buried the relics of the holy virgins. He began to preach to the people, urging them to turn toward Christ, they converted, and wanted build a large church. Saint Gregory had the relics of the holy nuns brought into the completed church. He brought King Tiridates before the bodies of the saints whom he had slain. He repented, and immediately his face was made whole once more. All of Armenia converted to Christ, temples of idols were destroyed, & churches were built. Saint Gregory ordained priests, established schools, founded monasteries, and provided for the good order of the Church. Going into the wilderness, he departed to the Lord. His son Aristanes was made a bishop in Cappadocia, and was one of the 318 holy Fathers at the Council of Nicea.
