New monastery for Sisters established in Illinois

St. Nicholas Eparchy has been enriched with an addition of a monastic community. On July 12, 2021 Bishop Benedict (Aleksiychuk) greeted the monastic sisters arriving in Chicago from Ukraine. The Sisters, five in all, will be living in Richmond, IL (not far from Chicago) in a monastic location consisting of a chapel and a residence. The Lord has bestowed the Sisters with many gifts and talents that they can utilize in serving the faithful, but the greatest and the most priceless gift they bring with them is their prayers. When the church prays, it becomes a living church. The monastery is named The Dormition of the Mother of God, whose patron is the Univ Blessed Mother, and our Sisters have brought a replica of the icon of the Univ Blessed Mother here from Ukraine. The establishment of the monastery is a unique event that serves as a sign that our Eparchy is growing spiritually into a large, unified family. We are incredibly grateful to all who worked diligently to make it possible for the monastery property to become suitable both for living and praying. We are most grateful to God for such an enormous gift we have received that coincides during the year of the 60th Anniversary of St. Nicholas Eparchy. The St. Nicholas Eparchy was established in the United States with its Cathedral located in Chicago, IL, when Pope John XXIII signed a papal decree on July 14, 1961.

During this eparchial anniversary year, on August 28, 2021, we will have the first **Pilgrimage to The Monastery of the Dormition of the Mother of God**, where we will celebrate the opening and blessing of this monastery and we invite all of you to take part in this joyous occasion. A new Priest and new Deacon for the Eparchy

On August 1, 2021 **Deacon Martin Nagy** will be ordained to the Priesthood and **Subdeacon Andrii Oliynyk** will be ordained as a Deacon. Deacon Martin Nagy was born in Beech Grove, Indiana in 1958. Deacon Martin attended Catholic schools and in 1981 graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business before entering St. Josaphat Seminary at Quincy University in Illinois. Upon completing St. Josaphat Seminary and the Catholic University of America, he was ordained as a Deacon and accepted into the Ukrainian Catholic Church. Currently he is serving as a Deacon at St. Michael Parish in Tucson, AZ. Subdeacon Andrii Oliynyk was born in 1991 in Chortkiv, Ukraine. Subdeacon Andrii had graduated with a power-engineer degree of Lviv Polytechnic National University and in 2014 he became a student at the Seminary of the Holy Spirit in Ukraine. During his education Subdeacon Andrii was organizing children's summer camps, visiting cancer-diagnosed children in hospitals, and working with the military in Ukraine. In 2019 he was accepted into the service of the ministry as a reader, candle bearer and Subdeacon at St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral.

Authority of the Council – Authority of the Church

The authority of the Councils is based also on their ecclesiological grounding. A council is not an independent, autonomous body, additional, coming from outside, acting unilaterally. It is not the product of accidental circumstances in history and imposed afterwards. It is closely, or rather organically, related with the very essence of the Church. This body of Christ is a living organism, destined to grow, to face difficulties during this process, to be implanted in other regions of the world needing inculturation and a certain adaptation.

Such embodiment and multifaceted ministry creates problems, tensions, even divisions and in spite of the good will of the local

bishop and pastors, the convocation of as a major assembly is considered as a natural instrument, salutary and indispensable.

The official voice of the catholicity and the koinonia of all the other sister churches, in harmony and guided by the Spirit, would only provide the new assessments, possible remedies and solutions. The functioning of such a council was such that the opinions and requests at issue found expression from the very womb of the Church. Once the decision was made, the people had a part in receiving it and publicizing it (Acts 15:22) as is seen in the first assembly of Jerusalem.
