Who is Holy Martyr Leontius?

Holy Martyr Leontius was Greek by origin and lived in the 1st century, during the reign of Vespasian. He served as a military-chief in the imperial army in the Phoenician city of Tripoli and, thanks to his bravery, his good sense and his administrative virtues, he had a brilliant military career, succeeding in becoming senior general. Leontius had never concealed his faith in Jesus Christ. In addition, he continued to stand by his fellowmen who needed his support. While Leontius was in Africa, the governor Adrian received a report that Saint Leontius had turned many away from worshipping the pagan gods. The governor sent the tribune Hypatius with a detachment of soldiers to Tripoli so as to find and arrest him. Thanks to the miracle the Holy Spirit, Hypatius was immediately healed from a terrible disease. Then, the



tribune Hypatius and the soldier Theodoulus asked Saint Leontius to enlighten them with faith in the True God and immediately believed in Jesus Christ. As they would not renounce Christ when ordered by the governor Adrian, they endured with courage horrible tortures. Seeing the steadfastness of these saints Hypatius and Theodoulus, they beheaded them. Next, seeing that nothing could make Leontius renounce Christ, the governor Adrian gave orders to beat the sufferer with rods until he died. They then threw the body of the holy Martyr Leontius outside the city, but Christians reverently gave it burial near Tripoli. The death of the holy martyrs occurred between 70-79. The accusation against Saint Leontius, and his sufferings and death are recorded on tin tablets prepared by the court scribe [commentarisius]. These tablets were placed at the grave of the holy martyr.


Prove Your Faith by Your Trust

'Look at the birds of the air,' says Jesus. What a splendid example for our faith to follow! Nothing is more persuasive than a glance at unthinking creatures who have received such beautiful dress from Providence. Surely we should be all the more ready to believe that human beings, if they entrust themselves completely to God and free themselves of all their worries, will not lack anything.
